School Improvement

Goals

- + To strengthen connections in the community and increase visibility by developing a clear and effective communication strategy.
- Review and refine the current Master Plan with the purpose of continuing to provide students and staff with the opportunity to learn and teach in a purpose built and wellresourced environment that supports the school's strategic direction.

Strategies

- Engage a marketing company to renew the school's marketing strategy, including developing 'on brand' imagery for advertising, refreshing the website and prospectus, and reassessing communication wording used within our school and to the wider community to establish the school's vision of striving for excellence in Christ centred education
- Appoint Project Manager, Architect and Consultants to lead the master planning process to ensure alignment with the school's mission and vision, while incorporating stakeholder feedback and input.

Progress / Achievement

- + Enrolments have reached a record high, with strong future growth across all year levels, including a high number of predicted Prep enrolments.
- Extensive community consultation occurred, site investigations and design processes are now underway.

Next Steps

- + Annual reviews, complete new website design and prospectus documentation
- Continue to collaborate with stakeholders and engage educational feedback on the master plan.
